City of Monroe Residential Expanded Recycling Rates – Effective January 1, 2026

* Rates shown below do not include taxes and fees.

Expanded Recycling	Fee	Special Preparation and Set-out Limits
Bulky waste – large appliances, furniture, large televisions, mattresses.	\$20.00/each	Call to schedule pick-up. 3 total per household during contract life. Limited to single-family households.
Fluorescent tubes and bulbs	Included	Limit 2 tubes/bulbs per collection. Limit 10 tubes/bulbs per year. Tubes must be no longer than 4 ft. Wrap tubes in newspaper and secure with tape. Place bulbs in a sealed bag. Place next to recycling container. Mark “fluorescent tubes.” Limited to single-family households.
Household batteries (alkaline, button and rechargeable)	Included	Place rechargeable and non-rechargeable batteries in separate, clear, sealed bags. Set on top of recycling container. Limited to single-family households.
Plastic bags and film (all clean, dry plastic shopping or produce bags, and plastic film)	Included	Place all plastic bags and film inside of one bag and tie to secure. Contaminated plastic bags such as cheese and meat wrappers, bags with paper labels, and bags with food or other residues are excluded.
Rigid plastics (5 gallon buckets, PVC pipe, laundry baskets, plastic lawn furniture, Big Wheels, coolers and Nalgene bottles)	Included	Rigid plastic material only. One dimension of the object must be less than 2 ft. Place items in cart or next to recycling cart. Call to schedule pickup for larger items.
Scrap metal	Included	All ferrous and non-ferrous scrap metal, including lids larger than 3" that is free of wood, plastic, rubber and other contaminants.
Small appliances (microwave ovens, toaster ovens, irons)	Included	Call to request pick-up. Limit 2'x2'x2' or smaller and less than 60 lbs. Set on top of or next to recycling container on specified day. Limited to single-family households.
Textiles	Included	Call to request pick-up. Place clean, dry clothing and household textiles in clear plastic bag and place on or next to recycling container on specified day.
Used cooking oil (FOG – fats, oil, grease)	Included	Limit 3 gallons per pick-up. Limit 10 total gallons per year. Seal uncontaminated oil (no large solids) in clean, clear, screw-top plastic jugs. Label jugs with name and address. Place next to recycling container. Limited to single-family households.
