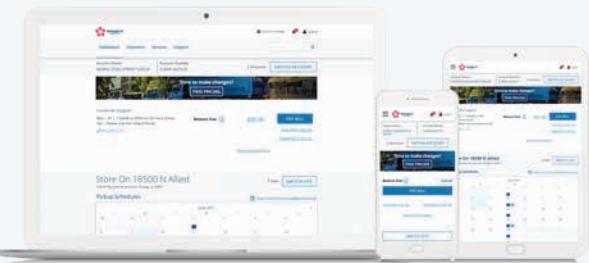
Cart Placement Guidelines

- ✓ Remove carts as soon as possible after collection

Alerts will be posted at RepublicServices.com/municipality/uninc-sc-wa. If conditions prevent safe collection, up to double the material will be collected on your next regular collection day at no additional charge.

- ✓ Flatten boxes
- ✓ 3 ft. x 3 ft. x 3 ft. max
- ✓ Keep dry
- ✗ Remove plastic bags



Metal Containers

Empty, clean and dry



Glass Bottles & Jars

- ✓ Empty, clean and dry
- ✓ Unbroken
- ✗ No lids



Plastic Bottles, Jugs & Tubs

- ✓ Empty, clean and dry
- ✓ Ignore the number. Recycle by shape – bottles, jugs, tubs only



Food Scraps and Yard Waste

✓ Cedar Grove-approved compostable bags are OK

NO PLASTIC BAGS OR FILM

NO SHREDDED PAPER

NO ROCKS, DIRT, BARK, PET WASTE

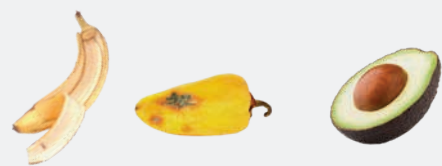

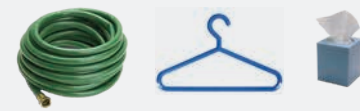
