



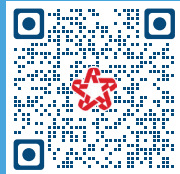

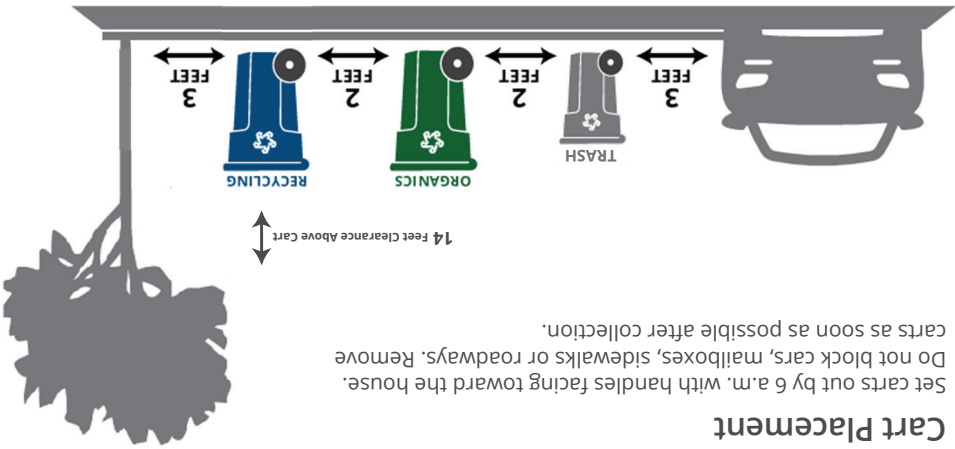
Residential Recycling, Trash & Yard Waste Guide (R2Y1)



Important to Know

Cart Placement

Set carts out by 6 a.m. with handles facing toward the house. Do not block cars, mailboxes, sidewalks or roadways. Remove carts as soon as possible after collection.



How to Prepare Your Extra Materials

Extra Trash

Place securely tied plastic bags labeled "trash" (max 50 lb. weight limit) next to the cart or a 32-gallon lidded can with handles.

Extra Recycling

Box, bundle or place in brown paper bags. Label "recycle" and place next to the recycling cart. Do not place items in plastic bags.

Extra Food/Yard Waste

Place in brown paper bags, a 32-gallon lidded can with handles (50 lb. limit), or bundles tied with twine (4' x 2' limit). Label "yard". No food scraps outside of the cart. Do not use plastic bags.

Hazardous Materials

Do not dispose in recycling, trash or food and yard waste carts.

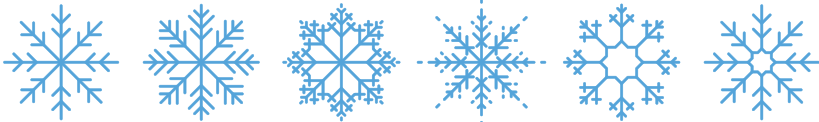

Bear Safety Tips

If weather conditions prevent the safe collection of your recycling, trash or yard and food waste, your cart will be collected on your next regular service day.

Easy Food Scrap Recycling/ Fácil reciclaje de restos de comida



- Keep compost container near the sink
- Add food scraps and food-soiled paper, such as napkins
- When full, empty into your yard waste cart

Cart Color: Green | Cart Size: 96-gallon

- ✓ Max. 3 containers (up to 96 gallons per container) or 3 lifts per pickup. Extras will be charged per 32 gallon unit.
- ✓ Cedar Grove-approved compostable bags are OK **Cedar-grove.com/kitchen-bags**
- ✓ Extras may be placed in paper lawn bags, boxes or cans clearly labeled “yard waste”. Untreated wood/branches may be bundled with natural twine (max is 4 ft. x 2 ft.) No food scraps in extra containers.

- No** rocks, dirt, bark or pet waste
- No** plastic bags, film or wrappers
- No** shredded paper

- ✓ If the item is not on the recycling list, place it in the trash

- No** hot ashes or coals
- No** hazardous waste
- No** batteries

2025 Calendar (Set Out Carts by 6 a.m.)

Set carts out with handles facing the house. Do not block cars, mailboxes, sidewalks or driveways. Remove carts as soon as possible after collection.

- Holidays** - No service on New Year's Day, Thanksgiving Day or Christmas Day. If collection falls mid-week, the collection day will shift one day the rest of the week (i.e., Tuesday collection will occur Wednesday).
- Recycling & Trash** - During BLUE weeks, place your recycling cart curbside next to your trash cart.
- Yard Waste & Trash** - During GREEN weeks, place yard and food waste cart curbside next to your trash cart.

Extra Trash: Place securely tied plastic bags labeled “trash” (max. 60 lb. weight limit) next to the cart or 32-gallon lidded can with handles. Extra fees will apply for additional units and for primary cans without closed lids.

Extra Yard Waste: Monthly organics subscription includes a max. of 3 containers (up to 96 gallons per container) or 3 lifts per pickup. Yard waste may be placed in carts, customer-owned lidded cans, boxes or paper bags. Food scraps must be in the Republic Services cart. Any containers/boxes, etc. exceeding this limit will be charged at the per unit (32 gallons) extras charge. Weight limit is 50 lbs. per container.

Extra Recycling: Box, bundle or place in brown paper bags, label “recycling”, and place next to recycling cart. Please do not place recycling in plastic bags. No extra fee.
