

Don't bag your recyclables. Place them directly into your recycling container. If bagged, they are considered trash!



# The RECYCLING Container's MOST FORBIDDEN items...

#### **Plastic Bags**

Recycle at local participating supermarkets or large pharmacies.



#### **Styrofoam**

Cups, plates and other food containers are not recyclable – trash them. For packing peanuts see tips below.





Disposable cutlery and dinnerware must be placed in the trash.

#### **Fabric & Shoes**

Clothing, linens, shoes and old toys: donate useable – if unusable put in the trash.





#### **Electronics (E-Waste)**

Requires special disposal and should never be put in the recycling or trash containers.


#### Napkins, Tissue & Diapers

Paper napkins/towels, tissue, diapers and other sanitary products must be put in the trash.

## TIPS:

- Do not put recyclable items in bags; place directly into the recycling container.
- Reuse **packing peanuts** or take them to the nearest participating postal/shipping store to reuse.
- Empty out containers before recycling.
- For all **scrap metal** please schedule a pick-up with Republic Services by calling 619-421-9400.
- Donate useable items such as clothing, shoes, linens, toys, etc.
- Take **E-Waste** and Household Hazardous waste to the Household Hazardous Waste Facility at 1800 Maxwell Road. You can also take E-Waste to Main Street Recycling at 1751 Fourth Avenue. Home pick-up is available; please call 619-691-5122 for more information.









#### **Food Packaging**

Pizza or take-out boxes and food/candy wrappers are not recyclable – trash them.
