What is SB 1383?

Mandatory Organics Recycling

Yard Waste/ Organics

Senate Bill (SB) 1383 requires all California cities to reduce emissions of short-lived climate pollutants (SLCP) by reducing organic waste disposal by 75% by 2025.

Organic wastes in landfills emit 20% of the state's methane, a climate super pollutant 84 times more potent than carbon dioxide. Diverting organic waste to recycling can significantly reduce these local air quality emissions.

Republic Services is here to help you understand your responsibilities, and make it as easy as possible to comply with state law SB 1383 by subscribing to the Organics Collection Services.

To comply, businesses and multi-family complexes must first separate their organic waste from other waste, and then subscribe to the collection service.

Together **we can help the State meet its goal** to reduce organic waste disposal by 75%



Beginning April 1, 2022, all businesses and multifamily complexes are required to recycle their organic waste.

If you own a business or multi-family complex, you are required to divert organic materials from the landfill by subscribing to and participating in the organics collection service provided by Republic Services.

Organic waste includes food waste, food-soiled paper, and landscape trimmings and prunings.

If you have a cart for food waste only, you may place the food waste and food-soiled paper in clear plastic bags. If you have a curbside cart for commingled food and green waste, the food waste may be placed in paper bags, but no plastic or compostable bags will be allowed.

Republic Services provides organics collection service to commercial customers based upon a rate schedule approved by the City of Rosemead. Each business or multi-family complex customer will need to sign up for services and pay the corresponding monthly fees. Republic Services will be visiting all Rosemead commercial customers to assist them with enrollment and right-sizing their service levels based upon their waste streams and volume needs. Yard Debris

Flowers, grass cuttings, leaves, weeds, small tree and brush trimmings, yard trimmings

Food Scraps

Fruits, vegetables, bones, coffee grounds, dairy products, eggshells, fish, meats, grain products and baked goods (Food waste may be placed in paper bags to help reduce odor and maintain cleanliness in the green organics cart.)

Food-Soiled Paper

Greasy pizza boxes, paper plates, napkins, paper towels

No: Plastic bags, bamboo, dead animals, dirt, rock, sand, lawn sod, manure or pet waste, wood (coated or painted), wood from construction projects, recyclable materials, charcoal or ashes, trash
