With these resources, you will know what goes in which container in accordance with the Otay landfill requirements, the correct size containers for your property, and if you are in compliance with the requirements for Senate Bill 1383.

### How to place containers for collection



#### DUMPSTERS

Do not block access for driver. If inside a dedicated room, allow access for driver or have dedicated person on-site move to accessible location for driver.



#### CARTS

- Face carts toward the street with wheels against the curb or gutter the night before or by 7 a.m. on your scheduled service day.
- Allow at least 3 feet between carts and 6 feet between carts and other objects. Make sure lids are securely shut.
- Do not place hot ashes, dirt, rock, concrete or hazardous items in your carts.

### Holidays

Republic Services observes the following holidays:

New Year's Day	Labor Day
Thanksgiving Day	Memorial Day
Christmas Day	Independence Day

If your service day falls on or after one of these holidays, it will be delayed by one day. For all other holidays, your service day will remain the same.



## Know what to throw

When it comes to the blue recycling containers, always remember to keep materials empty, clean and dry.

#### Tips for Recycling:

- Aim to recycle clean materials that are not contaminated with food, oils, etc.
- If you are recycling cardboard, break down boxes so that they are flat. This will save you space in your container for other recyclable materials and prevent overflowing containers.
- Make sure all liquids or other contents are removed from bottle or jugs.
- Never bag your recycling! Make sure all recyclables are LOOSE when they reach the containers that are serviced by our drivers.
- Refer to the list of recyclable items listed in this flyer if unsure.

How to Produce Less Waste

All customers must divert organic materials as well as recycling, but how can you produce less waste all together? Zero waste can be achievable, and can start with a few simple steps.

- 1. Make sure all staff has been trained on recycling and organics streams. Signage and educational materials can be requested from Republic Services.
- 2. Donate old appliances and office furniture before throwing it out.
- 3. Offer a donation service for residents to avoid throwing out furniture during move-outs.
- 4. Encourage staff to use reusable mugs and dishware.
- 5. Discourage printing documents, and encourage saving to computers as an alternative.
- 6. Only make online purchases from companies that package in recyclable materials.
- 7. Purchase office supplies that can be re-used or refilled, such as pens and ink cartridges.
