Managing Your Packing Materials

Moving Boxes

Reuse: Post on www.Craigslist.org or www.Freecycle.org.

Recycle: Flatten and place in the Recycle Bin/Cart.

Newspaper & Packing Paper

Reuse: Use this to line your Food Scraps Kitchen Pail, as gift wrapping paper, or again as packing paper.

Recycle: Place in the Recycle Bin/Cart.

Bubblewrap

Reuse: Post on www.Craigslist.org, www.Freecycle.org, or place in the Landfill Bin/Cart.

Foam Packing Peanuts

Reuse: Drop off at a mailing center such as a local UPS store – call first to confirm they will accept the material, or put in the Landfill Bin/Cart.

Safety Tips for Multi-Family Complex

Keeping Our Community Kids Safe

At Republic Services, we know our big trucks are the stars of the morning! We love seeing the waves from the balconies, but safety in our shared spaces is our #1 priority. Help us keep your little ones safe with these “Neighborhood Hero” tips:

- **Watch from the Balcony or Sidewalk:** Encourage kids to watch the action from a safe distance, like a balcony, a window, or well back on the sidewalk. Please avoid letting children play near the large dumpsters or enclosures.
- **The “Mirror Rule”:** Large trucks have big blind spots. Stay at least 50 feet away—if you can’t see the driver’s mirrors, they can’t see you!
- **Hold Hands in Parking Lots:** Collection day means extra movement in the parking areas. Please keep a close eye on children and pets when walking to your car or the mailboxes.
- **Keep Access Clear:** Please ensure cars are parked within their lines and not blocking the enclosure gates. This allows our drivers to work quickly and safely without extra maneuvering.
- **Wait for the Wave:** If you are driving through the complex, please never pass a truck while it is loading. A little patience keeps everyone safe!



Battery Recycling Safety Reminder

Improperly disposed household batteries are one of the leading causes of fires in recycling trucks and processing facilities. When batteries are placed inside recycling, compost or landfill bins/carts, they can become crushed or damaged during collection, causing chemical reactions that will ignite.

To help protect collection workers, equipment, and the community, Union City residents are reminded to recycle batteries properly.

How to Recycle Household Batteries:

For your convenience, the City of Union City has established battery collection stations at City Hall and in our community centers. Look for the battery drop-off display at the following locations:

- City Hall, 34009 Alvarado-Niles Road
- Ruggieri Senior Center, 33997 Alvarado-Niles Road
- Mark Green Sports Center, 31224 Union City Blvd
- Kennedy Community Center, 1333 Decoto Road
- Holly Community Center, 31600 Alvarado Blvd

Do not place loose batteries inside any bin/cart.

Proper battery recycling helps prevent fires, protects workers and drivers, and keeps hazardous materials out of landfills. Thank you for doing your part to keep Union City safe and environmentally responsible.



Reuse is best!

Before your collection of unwanted items that are in good condition, consider if they can be donated or sold to a local thrift store or through an online community group such as Freecycle, Nextdoor, Facebook Marketplace, or Buy Nothing group. If your item is damaged, consider if it can be repaired. The RE:Source guide available at StopWaste.org has handy information on reuse, repair, recycling and safe disposal.
