

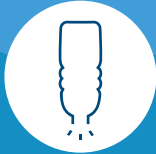
Recyclables should be loose (*no bags*)



Empty. Remove any remaining food or liquid.



Clean. Wipe or lightly rinse the item.



Dry. Shake out excess moisture or air dry.

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)

It is illegal to throw hazardous waste in ANY of your carts.

Door-to-Door Pickup: By appointment only. Dispose of paint, cleaning products, pool chemicals, car batteries (no EV), household batteries, gasoline, cooking oil and more. Go to [RepublicServices.com/BeniciaCA](https://www.RepublicServices.com/BeniciaCA) and look for the HHW appointment button to schedule a **FREE** Door-to-door pickup. **A large HHW bag will be sent to you.** Keep items in original container or pour liquids like cooking oil into a plastic container or milk jug and tape the lid to close securely and label contents. Nothing can be leaking. Place items in HHW bag. Place in driveway, and a hazmat team will collect on scheduled pickup day. *Note: The Devlin Rd. Transfer Station, American Canyon, and Central Contra Costa Sanitation District, Martinez, do not accept HHW drop-offs from Benicia Residents.*

Old Medications: There is a drop box for old pharmaceuticals at the Benicia Police Dept., 200 E L St. It is outside (under surveillance) with 24/7 access. Instructions are posted at the box. Please leave only controlled (doctor prescribed) items.

Garbage Cleanups: Residents may schedule three (3) FREE on call cleanups per year. Cleanups can be used to discard up to four (4) cubic yards (approx. 18 x 32-gallon bags) of extra trash. **NO GREEN WASTE ACCEPTED.** Call Customer Service to schedule an on-call cleanup. Bulky Item Pickup: Residents have three (3) FREE large item pickups per year. Call Customer Service to schedule a pickup. Items included are appliances (dishwasher, washer, dryer, stove, refrigerator, hot water heater, freezer, air conditioner, swamp cooler), electronics, furniture/mattresses, and tires. If you need more items picked up within a year, they can be picked up for a fee.

Drop Off Facility

Take antifreeze, batteries, car batteries (No EV), motor oil (+filters), paint, aerosols, and mercury thermostats to Republic's Drop Off Facility at the Benicia Corp. Yard, 2400 E. 2nd St., open Saturdays 9am-noon. No appointment is needed. Other chemicals need a special door-to-door pickup. Bring your driver's license with Benicia address.

Payment Options

There are 4 convenient ways to pay your bill:

2. **By mail,** using the envelope provided with your bill.
3. **By phone** with American Express, Discover, MasterCard or Visa. Checks are not accepted over the telephone.
4. **In person** at Republic Services' office at 441 N. Buchanan Circle, Pacheco, CA 94553, or at West America Bank, 20 Solano Square (must have payment stub).

Senior Discount

A senior discount is available for residents who are at least 60 years of age. Contact the City of Benicia Finance dept. for an application.

Going on Vacation?

Please schedule vacation holds in advance: Minimum 2 weeks per hold. Maximum 4 holds per year. Call Customer Service at 707.747.0608 for additional information.

Recycle Used Oil and Oil Filters

- Put motor oil in clear plastic container like a milk jug.
- Tape lid tightly shut.
- Maximum 3 gallons oil per pickup.
- Crush, open or puncture, then drain oil filter (with puncture at lowest point) to ensure the anti-drain-back valve is empty. More info: www.dtsc.ca.gov.
- Place filter in sealable plastic bag and seal.
- Place oil and filter beside recycling cart.

Cart Setout Instructions

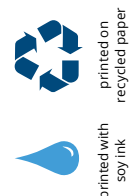
Place carts out by 6:00am or the night before your collection day. Set carts next to the curb and at least 3 feet away from other carts and vehicles. Cart weight limit is 150 lbs. Cart lids should be completely closed. You may be charged for extra overflowing material.

Senate Bill 1383

Food Scrap Recycling

How do you get your food scraps to your green cart? It's easy. Use a food waste pail. To keep it clean, you can line it with newspaper, a paper bag, or a BPI-Certified Compostable bag (the only type of Compostable plastic we can accept).

If you don't have a pail, contact Customer Service, 707.747.0608, and request one. The pail is FREE!

Important: Compostable plastics such as cold cups and utensils do not break down completely in our composting process. These should go in your garbage cart.
