

Household Hazardous Waste

It is illegal to throw hazardous waste in ANY of your carts: Take paint, pesticides, solvents, personal care products, and other household chemicals, FREE OF CHARGE, to Central San’s Household Hazardous Waste facility at 4797 Imhoff Place in Martinez, Monday–Saturday from 7:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. For more info, go to centralsan.org/hhw or call 800.646.1431.

Household batteries, compact fluorescent light (“CFL”) bulbs, and used oil and oil filters can be placed curbside for recycling. Batteries and CFLs must be sealed in clear plastic bags. Used oil can be placed in a clear plastic container like a milk jug and taped tightly closed. Oil filters must be drained before being sealed in a plastic bag. The contained items can be placed next to the brown recycle cart. Call 1.800.CLEANUP to locate nearby used oil recycling drop-off centers.

Landfill Waste Cleanups

In addition to the annual Citywide cleanup day for extra landfill and green waste, residents may schedule two FREE on-call landfill waste cleanups per year. Cleanups must be scheduled in advance and can be used to discard up to three cubic yards (*approx. 18 x 32 gallon bags*) of extra landfill waste. No items over four feet long and two feet in diameter, and no item or bag over 50 lbs each. NO GREEN WASTE ACCEPTED or the material will be tagged and left at the curb. Call Customer Service at 925.685.4711 at least three days before your next pickup day to schedule an on-call cleanup. For cleanup instructions go to RepublicServices.com/MartinezCA.

On-Call Cleanups for Recycling and Green Waste

Residents can schedule a total of four FREE on-call recycling or green waste cleanups per year. Cleanups must be scheduled three days in advance and can be used to discard up to three cubic yards (*approx. 18 x 32 gallon bags*). Green waste must be in paper or BPI-certified compostable bags, no plastic bags. Cardboard must be cut or bundled 3 ft x 3 ft. No single bag or bundle can be more than 50 pounds. To schedule a cleanup, call Customer Service, 925.685.4711.

Bulky Item Pickup

Residents have two FREE large item pickups per year. Call Customer Service at 925.685.4711 at least three days before your next pickup day to schedule a pickup. Items included are appliances (*dishwasher, washer, dryer, stove, refrigerator, hot water heater, freezer, air conditioner, swamp cooler*), electronics, furniture/mattresses, or tires. If you need more items picked up within a year, they can be picked up for a fee.

Going on Vacation?

Please schedule vacation holds in advance: Minimum two weeks per hold. Maximum four holds per year. Call Customer Service at 925.685.4711 to schedule.

If you report a missed pick up on carts set out properly and we do not pick it up by the end of the next business day, we will give you a partial bill credit.

Payment Options

There are four convenient ways to pay your bill:

- 2. By mail,** using the envelope provided with your bill.
- 3. By phone,** with American Express, Discover, MasterCard or Visa. Checks are not accepted over the telephone.
- 4. In person,** at Republic Services’s office at 441 N. Buchanan Circle, Pacheco, CA 94553, or by cash or check MoneyGram at Walmart, 1021 Arnold Dr., Martinez (use company code 6607 or 17433).

Senior Discount

A senior discount is available for residents who are at least 62 years of age. Visit RepublicServices.com/MartinezCA to download an application online or call customer service at 925.685.4711 to request a form by mail.

Cart Setout Instructions

Carts can be placed at the curb the day before the scheduled pick-up and must be removed from the curb by the end of the scheduled pick-up day (Ord. No. 1432 C.S., Chapter 8.16.200—*scan QR Code for details*). Set carts next to the curb and at least three feet away from other carts and vehicles. Cart lids must be completely closed, weight limit 150 lbs—overflowing carts may be charged a fee.

Senate Bill 1383: Composting organics is now the law!

SB 1383 is a statewide effort to reduce emissions of short-lived climate pollutants contributing to climate change by reducing organics waste disposal in landfills. SB 1383 requires annual route audits to monitor for contamination, so it's important to properly sort your materials into your recycle, landfill, and organics carts.

Residents must:

- Subscribe to and participate in the curbside organics and recycling programs.
- Properly sort organics into the green cart and recyclables into the brown cart.
- NOT put organics or recyclables in your blue landfill cart.
- NOT put organics in your landfill waste cleanups; use your green waste cleanups.

Food Scrap Recycling

How do you get your food scraps to your green cart? It's easy. Use a food waste pail. To keep it clean, you can line it with newspaper, a paper bag, or a BPI-Certified Compostable bag (the only type of Compostable plastic we can accept).

If you don't have a pail, contact Customer Service, 925.685.4711, and request one. The pail is FREE!

Important: "Compostable plastics" such as cold cups and utensils do not break down completely in our compost process. These should go in your landfill cart.

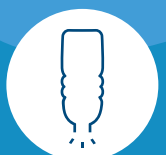
Empty. Remove any remaining food or liquid.
