# **Back-to-School, Sustainably:** Smart Ways to Reduce Waste This Semester

The back-to-school season often means a flurry of shopping and preparation—but it's also a great opportunity to adopt sustainable habits. With a little planning and creativity, families can reduce waste, save money, and teach kids the importance of caring for the planet. Read on for some simple ways to make this school year greener.

- Plan Ahead: Before hitting the stores, make a detailed list of needed supplies to avoid impulse buys. Sticking to essentials prevents excess clutter and reduces unnecessary waste.
- Repurpose First: Raid last year's backpack, desk, and pencil case before buying new items. Gently used notebooks, binders, and art supplies often get a second life with a little creativity.
- **3. Choose Recycled:** When shopping is unavoidable, look for supplies made from recycled materials, like paper, pencils, or binders.
- 4. Ditch Single-Use: Pack drinks in a reusable water bottle or thermos instead of disposable juice boxes. If milk cartons or other recyclables are used, rinse and recycle them properly.

- Pack Waste-Free Lunches: Use reusable containers, cloth napkins, and stainless steel utensils for packed lunches. A durable lunchbox eliminates the need for disposable bags.
- **6. Start or Join a School Recycling Program:** Team up with teachers or administrators to launch a recycling initiative if your school doesn't have one. Student involvement fosters long-term eco-awareness.
- 7. Recycle Right: Always empty, clean, and dry recyclables like yogurt cups or juice bottles before tossing them in the bin. Compost food scraps and food-soiled paper (like napkins and pizza boxes) in your organics container to comply with Senate Bill ("SB") 1383.


