Time for Lid Flippin'!

SB 1383 requires local jurisdictions to monitor contamination and proper sorting of organics and recycling by performing route audits and contamination checks. Republic Services employees may be in your neighborhood throughout the year performing "lid-flips" and looking into all 3 of your carts—landfill, recycle and organics—for proper sorting. **NO bags are opened, and no contents are touched; auditors may leave an educational "OOPS" tag if something should have gone into a different cart.** If you see an auditor in your neighborhood, feel free to say hello and ask any questions about what goes where, where you can take hard to recycle items, and any suggestions to make sorting easier and cleaner!

Here are a few sorting suggestions based on these audits:

- **DO NOT BAG RECYCLABLES.** If you collect your recycling in bags, please empty the contents into your RECYCLE cart and place the bag in the GARBAGE cart.
- Styrofoam, plastic strapping, disposable gloves, and all plastic utensils (even those labeled compostable) are trash and should be disposed of in the GARBAGE cart.
- **No e-waste in any cart.** Call customer service at **925.685.4711** to schedule a pickup.

BAGS: Compostable BPI (meets ASTM 6400 Standard) or Paper Bags; No Plastic Bags

Recyclables should be loose (no bags). Batteries and CFLs can be placed separately in clear bags beside the recycle cart. Recycle motor oil in clear plastic containers with lid secured and drain oil filters and put in plastic bag, curbside.

Organics should be loose (no bags) or in compostable or paper bags only. No plastic bags. A second green cart is available for an additional fee. Call Customer Service, 925.685.4711, to request one.
