Recyclables—Empty, clean, and dry recyclables can go in your onsite recycling containers. Make sure you flatten your cardboard!

Organics—Cleaned out your fridge and cupboards? Old/spoiled food, paper, plants, paper plates, napkins, and paper towels can go into your onsite organics containers.

Reuse

Before you throw anything away, try seeing if someone else wants it or if you can donate it:

- **Craigslist**—Postings are free and there are community classifieds. Visit: www.craigslist.org.
- **Freecycle Network**—Grassroots network to get rid of and find free stuff even cardboard boxes! Each local online group is moderated by a volunteer. Membership is free. Visit: www.freecycle.org
- **LetGo, Facebook Marketplace, and Buy Nothing Groups**—Easy way to buy and sell second hand goods. Visit www.letgo.com and www.facebook.com.
- **Nextdoor**—Community app to connect neighbors and features a “For Sale and Free” section. Visit www.nextdoor.com.
- **Thrift and Consignment Stores**—Goodwill, St. Vincent de Paul, Salvation Army, and Hospice Thrift Store are all good choices for donations. Call first to make sure what they are accepting. Visit resource.stopwaste.org.
- **Offerup.com**—Buy and sell locally.
- If you have mattresses, please contact your property manager for proper disposal.

Electronic Waste

Computers, cords, printers, key boards, mice, monitors, televisions, and other E-Waste are not allowed in the trash. Please contact your property manager to schedule an E-Waste pickup or take to a local recycler such as Rapid Recycle in Pacheco. Visit resource.stopwaste.org to find a location near you.

Household Hazardous Waste

Paint, solvents, cleaners, pesticides, household batteries, cooking oil, and other hazardous products cannot go in the trash. You can take them to the facilities below. Please select the facility that covers where you live:

- **Central Contra Costa Sanitary District**—(For residents who live in Alamo, Clayton, Clyde, Concord, Danville, Lafayette, Martinez, Moraga, Pleasant Hill, Orinda, and San Ramon). Free of charge to residents who are serviced by Central San. No appointment necessary. Visit www.centralsan.org/hhw, 4797 Imhoff Place, Martinez or call (800) 646-1431.
- **Delta Diablo Sanitation (Delta Diablo)**—(For residents who live in Antioch, Bay Point, Bethel Island, Brentwood, Byron, Discovery Bay, Knightsen, Oakley, and Pittsburg). Free of charge to residents who are serviced by Delta Diablo. Visit deltadiablo.org/household-hazardous-waste, 2500 Pittsburg-Antioch Hwy, Antioch or call (925) 756-1900.
