



Apartment/Condo Recycling Laws

SB 1383: Reducing Organic Waste

State law, SB 1383, is a statewide effort to reduce emissions of short-lived pollutants by reducing organics waste disposal. Organic material accounts for more than half of the material in California’s waste stream. Greenhouse gas emissions caused by the decomposition of organic material in landfills contribute to global climate change.

Residents are required to separate organics, including all food scraps, uncoated food-soiled paper and yard trimmings, for composting. Go to calrecycle.ca.gov/organics/slcp, for more information. Residents can participate by preventing/reducing food waste, composting at home and using the green organics cart.

Mandatory Commercial Recycling

State law, AB 341, requires apartments and condo complexes generating 4 cubic yards or more of trash per week to have a recycling program. For more information about AB 341, visit: calrecycle.ca.gov/recycle/commercial.

Household Hazardous Waste

It is ILLEGAL to put e-waste in your carts and bins. You can drop off many e-waste items for free at Rapid Recycle in Martinez (rapidrecycle.net) or the Concord Recycling Center (concordrecyclingcenter.com) – please contact them in advance to confirm. You can also ask your Property Manager to schedule an e-waste pick-up with Republic Services.

Medical Sharps:

It is ILLEGAL to dispose of sharps in your carts and bins. California has a FREE mail-back sharps program – visit sharpstakebackcalifornia.org to request your free mail-back container and service.

Large Item Pickups

If you have furniture, mattresses or other large items, contact your property manager. They can schedule a bulky pick-up for a fee. Call 925.685.4711 to schedule.



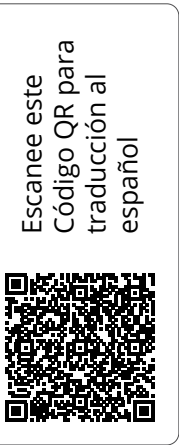
Prevent Food Waste and Fight Climate Change

When we waste food, we waste all the energy, water, and resources that went into producing that food and getting it to our kitchen.

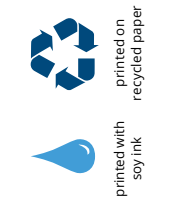
If we plan our meals a little better, store our food properly, and eat what we have, we can save food and money.

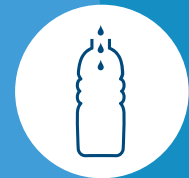

Keep Recycling Clean

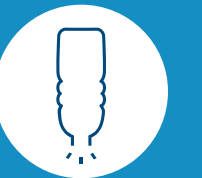
To meet strict quality requirements in this new era of recycling, please make sure your recyclables are:



Empty. Remove any remaining food or liquid.



Clean. Wipe or lightly rinse the item.



Dry. Shake out excess moisture or air dry.

Food Scrap Composting



Use the pail for storage before emptying food scraps into the green organics cart. Line your food scrap pail with newspaper, a paper bag, or a BPI-Certified Compostable bag (the only type of Compostable plastic we can accept).

Important: Biodegradable plastics AND REGULAR PLASTICS are not acceptable because they don't break down completely in our compost process.
