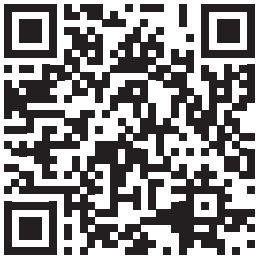

Dispose of Hazardous Waste Properly

Hazardous Waste, such as batteries, can pose a safety risk to facility workers and cause truck fires. Hot summer weather makes it especially important to dispose of hazardous waste properly. Never place hazardous materials, such as paint, lightbulbs or motor oil, in your Dry, Wet, or Customized containers. As a Santa Clara County business, you may qualify for the Very Small Quantity Generators (VSQG) program that allows small generators to easily dispose of their hazardous material. How to Help Prevent Illegal Dumping

Illegal dumping is the unlawful disposal of waste on public or private property. It is not only an eyesore but also dangerous, especially when it blocks roads or alleys. If illegal dumping occurs at your business, call Republic Services at (408) 432-1234 to order an extra pickup and request assistance to prevent future dumping. To preserve public health and safety, businesses are responsible for disposing of waste accumulated on their properties.

Helpful Tips to Prevent Illegal Dumping at Your Business:

- Lock your bins. Make sure to remove locks before your service day. Republic Services also offers locking services for your convenience at an additional small fee. Please contact Republic Services to learn more about this service.
- Keep your waste area clean — tidy waste storage areas deter dumping
- Install cameras and motion-activated lighting
- Post “No Dumping” signs near your containers
