#### ON-CALL YARD WASTE & RECYCLING CLEANUPS

Recycle extra yard waste, extra corrugated cardboard or both with up to three (3) free on-call recycling cleanups per year. Household batteries and compact fluorescent lights (CFLs) can also be recycled with your on-call recycling cleanups. To schedule a recycling cleanup, request it online at site.RepublicServices.com/site/pachecoca or call (925) 685-4711.

Recycling cleanups are in addition to biweekly Yard trimmings yard waste and weekly recycling service and are scheduled for pickup the same day as regular recycling and yard waste service. If you request for a pickup on a day other than your regular recycling and yard waste service day, a fee will apply.

#### Extra Yard Waste

- After filling yard waste container, place extra leaves and yard clippings in cardboard boxes, paper bags or containers that are 32 gallons or less in volume. Maximum 75 lbs. per container. (No plastic bags.)
- Containers will not be taken away.
- Tree branches and prunings must be 3 feet or less in length and 3 inches or less in diameter. Bundle with string or cord.
- Place extra yard waste containers curbside by 6 a.m. of pickup day or night
- Keep extra material at least 4 feet away from containers.

#### Corrugated Cardboard

- Flatten corrugated cardboard and trim to 4 feet or less on each side. Bundle with cord or string. No maximum on bundle's thickness if less than 50 lbs.
- Place cardboard curbside by 6 a.m. of your pickup day or the night before.
- Keep extra material at least 4 feet away from containers.

#### Household Batteries and CFLs

- Place batteries in clear, quart-size plastic bag, i.e., Ziploc. Single-use AA, AAA, C, D and 9V batteries only. No rechargeables. (Visit www.call2recycle.org for rechargeables.)
- Place compact fluorescent lights (CFLs) in plastic bag. No broken bulbs or a fee will be charged for handling the broken CFLs. (Broken CFLs are hazardous; see Toxics page for Delta HHW Collection Facility information.)
- Place bagged batteries and CFLs **NEXT TO** recycling container (**NOT** in container).

#### REMINDERS

- Don't place recyclables, yard waste or hazardous wastes in garbage container.
- Be sure all materials fit inside the container with lid closed.
- Place container at curb the night before or by 6 a.m. of your collection day.
- For missed service, please call within 24 hours.
- Leave at least three (3) feet of space between trash container and any other object, including yard waste and recycling containers and any obstacles such as mailboxes, cars or portable basketball hoops.
- Before discarding items, consider reusing or donating.

### Help Keep Antioch Clean by Using your 2 FREE On-Call Cleanups

Antioch residents may schedule two <u>free</u> cleanups per year at any time. Use cleanups to discard up to two cubic yards (approx. fourteen 32-gallon bags) of extra trash and items too large for garbage carts. To schedule a cleanup, request the service online at site.RepublicServices.com/site/pacheco-ca or call (925) 685-



4711. Additional bags can be picked up for \$2.50 per bag. Additional pickups can be scheduled for a fee.

#### Guidelines for Cleanups

- Place items at the curb before 6 a.m., preferably the night before your cleanup day.
- All items must be stacked in one place.
- Bag or tie items with rope, cord or string strong enough to keep bundles intact or place in containers, including metal and plastic trash cans. All containers will be taken away unless indicated otherwise with a note on the container.
- Place cleanup items in a single pile at a distance of 5 feet or more from your garbage cart.



#### Unacceptable Materials

- No single item may weigh more than 50 lbs. or be longer than 4 feet. Bags cannot weigh more than 50 lbs.
- No large car parts (transmission blocks, engines, etc.)
  - No rocks, dirt or concrete; no tree stumps or tree trunks.
- No hazardous waste including paint, oil filters, motor oil, antifreeze, car batteries, solvents, pesticides, cleaners, fluorescent bulbs. Hazardous waste must be taken to the Delta HHW Collection Facility.

#### OK for Bulky Item Pickup, Not Cleanup

Tires, furniture, mattresses, refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, stoves, appliances, TV sets, electronics such as DVD players, fax machines, printers. See Bulky Item page.

### Doing More - Beyond Curbside!

#### **REDUCE**

Reducing the amount of waste generated is the best option for protecting the environment.

#### Landfilled Plastics

Since the market is minimal for plastics #3 - #7, they often end up in the landfill. Try the following options to reduce waste generation:



- Buy goods in containers and packaging that are easier to recycle such as aluminum, glass, non-waxed cardboard and plastics #1 #2.
- When eating out, bring your own takeout containers and order drinks without the straw.

#### Lose your lawn; grow a garden

You can reduce yard waste by replacing a lawn with a water-efficient garden. You can get rebates of up to \$1,000 through the Contra Costa Water District's Water Efficient Landscape Rebate Program. Visit http://www.ccwater.com/conserve for information on this and other programs.

#### Choose to Reuse: Garage Sales & Donations

Make and save money with garage sales. Sell items you don't want or need and avoid disposal costs. The City of Antioch and Republic Services will sponsor the 9th annual Citywide Garage Sale the weekend of October 4-6, 2019. Register at www.antiochyardsales.com in September, 2019.

The following Saturday, October 12, 2019, Republic Services will sponsor the 9th annual Reuse Roundup. Items that are dropped off will be given to local causes and charities in Antioch.

#### RECYCLE - Empty, Clean, Dry

Recycling and the markets for recyclable materials have evolved. Overseas companies, mainly in China, no longer accept certain types of recyclable materials or recyclables that are not clean and contaminant free.

Extra attention is needed to reduce waste overall and to make sure correct materials go in the recycling and green containers.

Recycling works best when materials are **empty, clean and dry**. Place only the materials that you know are clean and recyclable in the recycling container. Your help with proper sorting can make a difference.

#### PROPER DISPOSAL

Many common items contain mercury, heavy metals and other toxic chemicals and must be disposed of properly. See Toxics page for details on proper disposal of used oils, electronics and other household hazardous wastes.

#### **Bulky Items**

Avoid using unlicensed haulers to pick up large, bulky items. Antioch residents may call (925) 685-4711 to schedule a bulky item pickup with Republic Services. See the Bulky Item page for a list of acceptable pickup items.

#### Illegal Dumping

### Household Hazardous Waste

### Oil Filters, Motor Oil and Cooking Oil

Recycle oil filters and motor oil curbside.

Recycle cooking oil at the Delta HHW Collection Facility.

#### Oil Filters, Motor Oil

- Pour <u>motor</u> oil into a clear plastic container, i.e., milk jug.
- Tape lid to close it securely.
- Place <u>beside recycling</u> container.
- Maximum 3 gallons of oil per pickup.
- Place filters in sealable plastic bag, i.e., Ziploc, seal.
- Place <u>beside</u> <u>recycling</u> container.

#### Cooking Oil

- Pour cooking oil into a clear container like a plastic milk jug or glass jar.
- Tape lid to close it securely.
- Recycle at the Delta HHW Collection Facility.



#### Household Hazardous Wastes

It is illegal to put hazardous waste in garbage or recycling container.

Recycle auto and household batteries, latex paint, anti-freeze, motor oil, oil filters, fluorescent bulbs, mercury thermometers, pesticides, solvents and other household chemicals

FREE OF CHARGE at the Delta HHW Collection Facility, 2550 Pittsburg-Antioch Highway, Antioch. Call (925) 756-1990 or visit www.ddsd.org.

#### Sharps

It is illegal to throw syringes, needles and lancets in your trash or recycling container. Call the Delta HHW Collection Facility at (925) 756-1990 to have a free sharps container mailed to you. Once full, the container can be dropped off at the facility. Visit us online at site.RepublicServices.com/site/pacheco-ca for more dropoff locations.

#### Your Options for TVs, Monitors, Electronics

State law bans CRTs (televisions and computer monitors) and other electronics from being placed in the garbage.

Republic Services offers ways to handle these items:

- Keyboards, mice, speakers and other computer peripherals can be placed in your brown recycling cart.
- Televisions, computer monitors and other electronics can be left out as an item in the bulky item service.
- Household batteries and CFLs (compact fluorescent lights) can be included in an on-call recycling pickup.

You can take e-waste to the Delta HHW Collection Facility, free of charge. Call (925) 756-1990 for hours and information, or visit www.ddsd.org.
