Sustainability in Action

How to Sort Food Waste

Step 1: Set Up Kitchen Containers

Designate an indoor container in the kitchen to collect food waste.



Step 2: Educate Staff & Tenants

Train household members to separate food waste.
Place education near collection containers.

Step 3: Recycle Food Waste

Empty food waste in the outdoor organics container.
Food waste should be loose or unbagged. Paper bags are also OK.

State-Mandated Recycling

In recent years, residents and businesses across the state have made changes in how they dispose of recyclable and organic waste. The effort is driven by state mandates aimed at increasing recycling and reducing harmful environmental impacts.

Organic waste includes food, food-soiled paper, and yard waste. Organic materials that end up in landfills decompose, creating methane gas, a greenhouse gas emission that negatively contributes to the environment.

Recyclables include paper, cardboard, plastic, glass, and metal. These materials can be processed and converted into new items.

Multi-family properties are required to recycle their organic waste and recyclable materials. To comply, eligible properties must be subscribed to a recycling and organics program through Republic Services. Tenants and staff can then separate their organic waste and recyclable materials from other waste, and place it in the appropriate container.

The City of Anaheim and Republic Services are here to help you understand your responsibilities and make it as easy as possible to comply with state law.
