This program helps smalland medium-sized businesses find ways to minimize their impact on the environment which can also save them money!

Businesses that participate in the program can get credit for green practices already in place and implement new actions that eliminate or reduce waste generated; find alternatives to hazardous materials; reduce energy and water consumption; and improve the quality of air, wastewater, and storm water discharges to become certified as a Green Business. Businesses, public agencies, and non-profit organizations are eligible to apply. Certified businesses get special recognition, are listed in the California Green Business directory, and enjoy the benefits of more efficient, healthy improvements that can attract new customers.
