SCHOOL SUPPLIES: Reuse Round-Up Results in 2026



The tally is in for our Second Annual School Supplies Reuse Round-up, and we're proud to announce that **147.1 pounds** of reusable school supplies were saved from the landfill this year. Collections took place at Sutter Elementary, which contributed 99.8 pounds, and the Antioch Community Center, which contributed 47.3 pounds. In total, the drive gathered over 50 binders and notebooks, two backpacks, thousands of markers, pens, and colored pencils, plus calculators, staplers, protractors, and various storage and decoration items. We're especially pleased to report that items damaged beyond repair weighed less than 10 pounds total.

Most of the collected supplies will be donated to Team Jesus, a volunteer-based nonprofit that provides free food and basic necessities to Antioch families at five locations. Last year, these donations helped many children prepare for the school year, and we expect the same positive impact again. Clothing donations will go to Grace's Closet, a nonprofit that provides clothing to anyone in need, and we're excited to expand our clothing collection efforts later this fall with additional school drives. Storage and decoration items are still being organized for potential donation to organizations like the YMCA, First Five, and Antioch Charter Academy, with any remaining items staying within the community.

We extend our heartfelt thanks to Sutter Elementary and the Antioch Community Center for hosting our collection locations. We learned a great deal this year and are already looking forward to expanding the program to more schools. Thank you to everyone who participated—we can't wait to see how this program continues to grow!
