# Residential Carts & Sizes

## Cart Sizes

Residential customers are provided with three collection carts:



**TRASH**



**RECYCLING**



**ORGANICS**

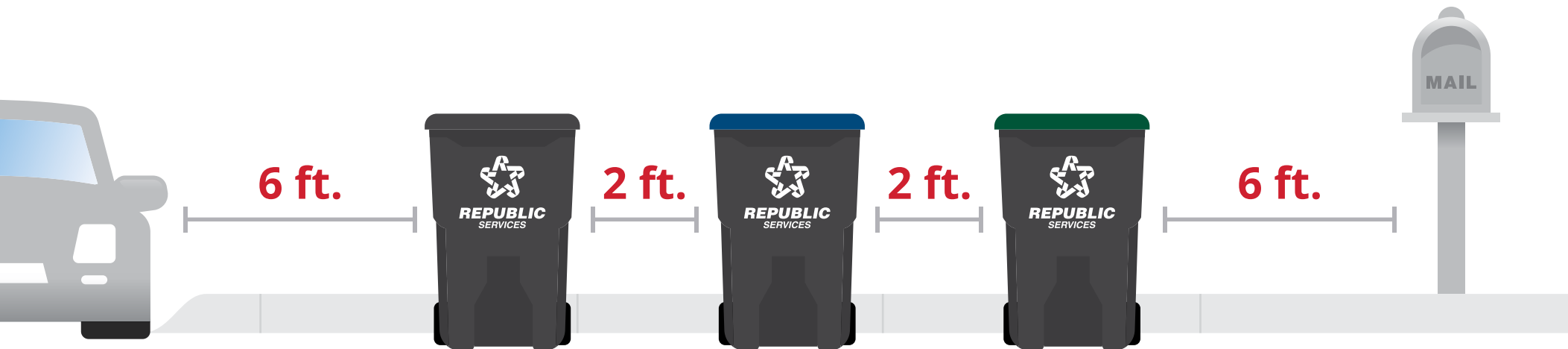
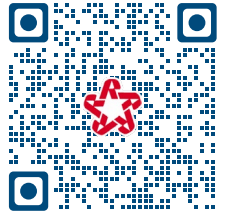
- ▶ Trash carts are available in sizes 35, 65 or 95 gallons.
- ▶ Recycling carts are 65 gallons only.
- ▶ Organics carts are available in 65 or 95 gallons.

## Cart Placement and Collection Day Guidelines

All carts are serviced weekly on your designated service day. To view your recycling, organics and trash collection day, scan the QR code.

- ▶ Carts should be placed at the curb with the lid openings facing the street.
- ▶ Make sure lids are closed.
- ▶ Overloaded carts may not be serviced.
- ▶ Place carts out by 6 a.m. on your scheduled service day.
- ▶ Remove empty carts from the curb by 10 p.m. on your service day.
- ▶ Place carts at least 2 feet apart from each other, and leave 6 feet of space between your cart and any other objects at the curb.



# Recyclables

## Acceptable Items *(keep all recyclables empty, clean and dry)*



### PAPER AND CARDBOARD

Recycle envelopes, office paper, newspaper, magazines, junk mail, catalogs, paperback books, phone books, brochures, greeting cards and file folders.



### METAL CANS

Recycle all food and beverage metal cans: steel, tin, bi-metal and aluminum.



### PLASTICS

Recycle plastics #1 through #7. Look on the bottom of the containers for a number inside the recycling arrows. Caps and lids are OK.



### GLASS

Recycle clear and colored glass.

## CRV Buyback Center

The Republic Services Buyback Center accepts all California Redemption Value (CRV) beverage containers, including #1 through #7 plastics containers, glass, aluminum containers and tin. The center also accepts cardboard, mixed paper, newspaper and phone books. No packing paper is accepted. The facility is located at 2901 Industrial Court, Fairfield, and open Monday – Friday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m. Closed for lunch between 11:45 a.m. – 1 p.m.

## Extra Cardboard

Extra cardboard boxes, big or small, can be dropped off at the CRV Buyback Center facility at 2901 Industrial Court, Fairfield, Monday – Friday, 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.



# Organics

## Acceptable Items



### FOOD WASTE

All prepared, cooked and spoiled foods, bread, coffee grounds, dairy products, cheese, eggshells and eggs, fruits and vegetables (pits and shells), meat and bones, rice, beans, grains and pasta, tea bags, loose leaf tea and seafood, including shellfish



### FOOD-SOILED PAPER

Greasy pizza boxes and paper bags, napkins and kitchen paper towels, paper take-out boxes and containers, waxed paper and butcher paper, coffee filters, kitchen-soiled paper, paper egg cartons, paper cups and plates



### YARD WASTE

Branches, stems and other plant debris not to exceed 13 inches, holiday greenery not to exceed 18 inches, flowers and floral trimmings, leaves, grass, natural cork, sawdust, chopsticks and toothpicks

## How to Use Your Kitchen Pail

Using Your Food Waste Pail Is as Easy as 1, 2, 3!

**STEP 1:** Place your kitchen food waste pail in a convenient area where food waste is generated.

**STEP 2:** Place your food scraps and food-soiled paper directly into your kitchen pail.

**STEP 3:** Empty the contents of your food waste pail into your outdoor organics cart.



## Compostable Bags

Line your kitchen pail with a paper bag, newspaper, or paper towels to help keep your food waste pail clean. Alternatively, line your food waste pail with compostable bags that are certified by the Biodegradable Products Institute (BPI).

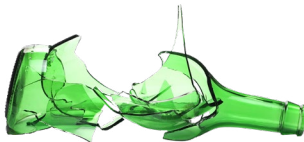

## Free Bulk Waste Collection

Each household is entitled to two free bulk waste pickups per year (January to December). Each pickup can include: 1) up to 3 cubic yards of waste material, and 2) two bulk waste items (sofa, mattress, large appliance). Call Republic Services for more information and to schedule a pickup. Items must be placed at the curb for collection before 6 a.m. Bulk waste may be serviced by different trucks, depending on the materials you are disposing. There is a charge for Freon® removal and for computer monitors and cathode ray tubes (CRTs).

## Landfill Coupon: 1 Free Trip

Each household receives 1 free landfill coupon annually. Each coupon is good for 1 free trip to Potrero Hills Landfill for disposal of up to 2 cubic yards of waste and 1 bulk waste item. Landfill coupons are mailed to households in January and are valid through December 31.



# Household Hazardous Waste & Universal Waste

The household hazardous waste (HHW) collection facility is open the 2nd and 4th Saturday each month from January to October, the 1st and 3rd Saturday in November and December, and the following Thursdays in 2026: January 29, April 30, July 30 and October 29. The facility is open from 9 am – 12 noon. Drop-off is by appointment only and is free to Fairfield residents. Proof of residency is required. For information and registration assistance, call **707.437.8971**.

Acceptable HHW Items	
<b>Paint</b>	Oil and latex paints, stains, varnishes, solvents, thinners and adhesives
<b>Automotive items</b>	Motor oil, oil filters, contaminated motor oil, antifreeze, gasoline and batteries
<b>Chemicals</b>	<b>Household:</b> oven cleaners, drain cleaners, bleach, sprays, waxes and polishes <b>Garden:</b> pesticides, herbicides, fertilizers, ant trap poison and gopher bait <b>Other:</b> pool chemicals, photographic chemicals, flammable liquids/gases, aerosol cans, roofing tar and roofing products
<b>Fluorescent lights</b>	Tubes, bulbs and other mercury-containing lamps
<b>Batteries</b>	AA, AAA, C and D cells and button batteries
<b>Mercury gauges</b>	Barometers, manometers and old thermostats
<b>Needles</b>	Must be placed in a clear, rigid-enclosed container with the lid taped closed to prevent spilling

*Restrictions: No single containers larger than five (5) gallons will be accepted. Maximum allowable quantity of 15 gallons or 125 pounds per trip.*

## BOPA Facility (Battery, Oil, Paint, Antifreeze)

The BOPA — batteries, oil (motor and cooking), paint (latex) and antifreeze collection facility, at 2901 Industrial Court, Fairfield, is open 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. (closed 11:45 a.m. – 1 p.m.,) Monday – Friday.

**Restrictions:** Maximum quantity allowed is 5 gallons latex paint, 5 gallons motor oil, 3 pounds household batteries, and 3 car batteries per resident per month. Oil and antifreeze must be in a sealed clear container. Proof of residency is required.

## Used Motor Oil & Filter Curbside Collection

Used motor oil and oil filters are picked up curbside for free in special jugs and bags. Place jugs and bagged filters next to your recycling cart. Do not place the containers inside the cart. To request jugs and bags, call Customer Service at **707.437.8900**. No other containers are accepted. We will replace the full jug with a clean one.

## City of Fairfield Battery Drop-Off Program

## Electronic Waste Collection

State law bans electronics in waste. Electronic waste must be taken to a licensed facility. Republic Services accepts small appliances and small electronics from Fairfield residents. Electronics weight limit is 60 lbs. Customers can bring up to 5 electronic items. Proof of residency is required. All batteries must be removed from electronic devices. The facility is located at 2901 Industrial Court, Fairfield, and is open 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. (closed 11:45 a.m. – 1 p.m.), Monday – Friday. For more information, call **707.437.8900**.



# Extra Services Available in Fairfield



## Free Compost Events

Free compost is available to Fairfield residents at biannual compost giveaway events, April 11 and September 12, from 9 a.m. until supplies run out. No trailers are permitted. For more information, contact the City of Fairfield.

## After-Christmas Special

On the first regularly scheduled pickup after Christmas Day, each household may put two 13-gallon bags next to the waste cart. This service is only permitted that day.

## Wheel-Out Service

Republic Services provides free wheel-out service to eligible residents who are physically unable to move the carts as verified by a medical certificate. The resident will need to annually sign a sworn statement stating that they live in a home with no one else capable of wheeling the cart to the curb.

## Free Extra Waste Pickup

Each household is entitled to 1 extra waste pickup per year. You must use the waste cart size assigned to the household. The extra service must be requested by phone.

## Avoid Contamination!

Contamination occurs when unaccepted materials are placed in recycling and/or organics carts. This can lead to:

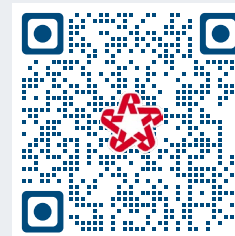
- ▶ Equipment damage
- ▶ Increased waste sent to landfills

To keep our recycling and organics program successful, only place accepted materials in your carts. If your recycling or organics cart is contaminated, a contamination fee may appear in your next bill.

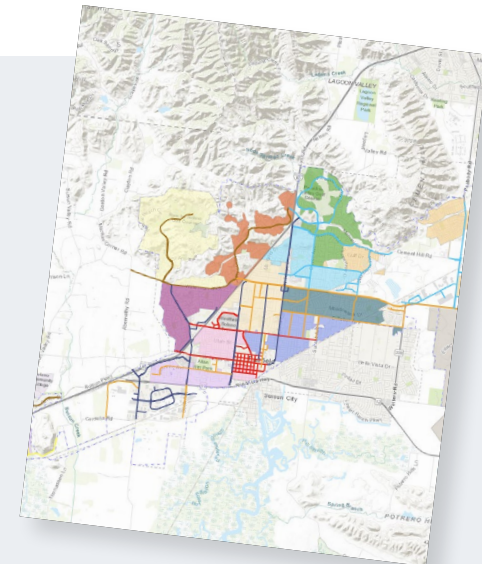

# Billing & Resources

## Billing Information

You will receive your bill from Republic Services and will be billed every other month at the beginning of the month (i.e. March bill will include February and March services).

## Payment Options

Customers have four ways to pay their bill:

2. By phone, toll-free at **877.692.9729**.
3. By mail, via the envelope in your bill.
4. In person at the Republic Services office at 2901 Industrial Court, Fairfield, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

## Lifeline Rate

For qualifying low-income households, there is a 15% reduction of standard service rates.

## Contamination Monitoring

The City of Fairfield is required to conduct regular route reviews and randomly inspect recycling, trash and organics carts to monitor for contamination and participation in the recycling and organics programs. Republic Services performs these route reviews and provides outreach and education to residents who place the wrong materials in their carts. To avoid contamination fees, please ensure that your recycling and organics carts are not contaminated with incorrect materials.

## Holiday Schedule

Republic Services observes Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and New Year's Day. If your regular service day falls on or after a holiday, service will be delayed one day. Residents who are usually serviced on Friday will be serviced on Saturday.
