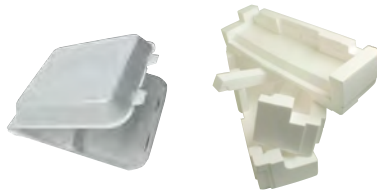

Kitchen Pail is Available – Contact Republic Services if you need a free kitchen pail to make collecting food scraps easier.

Bulky Item Collection – Residents with individual service can schedule two free on-call pickups annually.

Motor Oil Collection – Recycle used motor oil and oil filters at the curb. Appropriate oil jugs and filter bags must be used. Call 510-657-3500 for information.

Special Services & Discounts – Low income households and seniors over 70 years may be eligible for discounts. Backyard or side-yard collection is available for residents with disabilities.

Overage Bags — Overfilled containers cause litter and collection problems. Buying “overage” bags from Republic Services is the best option for occasional extra trash.

Cart Storage – Place carts at curb by 6 a.m. on your collection day. All carts must be removed from the street or curb and stored out of sight from public view within 24 hours after collection.

Fremont Recycling & Transfer Station – Public disposal for self-hauled waste is available at 41149 Boyce Road, Fremont. Construction debris, mattresses, appliances and landscaping debris, other materials can be delivered for a fee Monday – Saturday from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM.
