

Rate Increase

Dear Valued Customer,

Starting January 1, 2026, your monthly rates for collection and disposal of recycling, trash and organic waste will increase. While the waste services industry experienced a 5% increase in the cost of doing business, rates for Citrus Heights residents are only increasing 3.5%. Republic Services® looks forward to continuing our high level of service for Citrus Heights residents.

The specific increase for each residential account is determined by the size of the trash cart. The table below shows the new monthly rates for 2026 and the previous monthly rates from 2025

Effective Date	32-Gallon Trash Cart	64-Gallon Trash Cart	96-Gallon Trash Cart
January 1, 2026	\$30.77	\$34.20	\$42.64
January 1, 2025	\$29.73	\$33.04	\$41.20

What Does the Rate Pay For?

- ▶ Weekly trash and organic waste pickup
- ▶ Biweekly recycling pickup
- ▶ Access to the North Area Recovery Station (NARS) for household hazardous waste disposal: 4450 Roseville Road, North Highlands, CA
- ▶ Appointment-based pickup of home-generated sharps
- ▶ Curbside collection of used motor oil, oil filters and batteries on recycling day
- ▶ Neighborhood Cleanups (NCU): three per year*
- ▶ Extra leaf pickup: November – January (up to six bags on your weekly service day)
- ▶ Holiday tree pickup for three weeks following Christmas on weekly service day



*NCU material may not be set at the curb before 48 hours before the service day. For example, if your NCU service day is Wednesday, you may set out your material anytime between 6 a.m. on Monday and 6 a.m. on Wednesday. Materials set out in advance of the 48 hours may incur an "Improper Large Item Setout" fee.
