C&D Recycling

What is C&D?

Construction and demolition (C&D) is non-hazardous, uncontaminated material generated during construction, renovation, repair or demolition of buildings and other structures.

What happens to C&D?

Your project might be required to recycle 65% of C&D debris. Materials generated from certain construction projects must be recycled to meet required state building codes (CALGreen) and laws (Senate Bill 1383), which require 65% of all debris to be diverted from the landfill. To meet reporting obligations, the City of Santa Ana requires certain covered individuals pulling permits with construction and demolition debris to provide information on where the materials will be taken and the percentage of materials diverted from the landfill. All applicable project applicants must submit a Waste Reduction and Recycling Plan (WRRP) through Green Halo. A Waste Reduction and Recycling Plan application must be submitted before a permit may be issued. Go here to find out if you are required to submit an application: SantaAna.wastetracking.com.

When placing an order with Republic Services, please inform the Construction Team and Customer Service representatives that the services ordered are for C&D processing to receive diversion credit.

What can you do to reduce, reuse and recycle?

You can help divert C&D materials from disposal by practicing source reduction, salvaging, recycling and reusing existing materials, and buying used and recycled materials and products. You can:

- Salvage and reuse items of high value that can be reclaimed.
- Move or relocate a building instead of using traditional demolition.
- Dismantle buildings through deconstruction.

Roll-off containers cannot exceed 10 tons, per Department of Transportation regulations.
