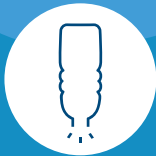




Empty. Remove any remaining food or liquid.



Clean. Wipe or lightly rinse the item.



Dry. Shake out excess moisture or air dry.

Household Hazardous Waste

It is illegal to throw hazardous waste in ANY of your carts.

Take paint, pesticides, solvents, personal care products, and other household chemicals FREE OF CHARGE to a local household hazardous waste facility. It is illegal to put sharps (syringes, needles) in garbage or recycling. Sharps must be in a medical sharps container and disposed of through a mail-back program or at an office drop-off site. If you live in Alhambra Valley, Central San, Concord, Morgan Territory, Pacheco or Uninc. Pleasant Hill, go to Central San's Household Hazardous Waste Facility, 4797 Imhoff Place in Martinez. For more information, call 800.646.1431 or visit [CentralSan.org/hhw](https://www.CentralSan.org/hhw).

If you live in Bay Point, go to Delta Diablo Household Hazardous Waste Collection Facility, 2550 Pittsburg-Antioch Hwy, Pittsburg, CA 94565 (For mapping apps try entering 2550 Arcy Ln, Antioch). Old Pills Piling Up?

Remove labels, place the whole pill bottle with pills (minus label) or empty the pill bottle into sealable plastic bag and take old medications to the local sites below (Mon–Fri, 8am–5pm) or visit [cccrecycle.org/hhw](https://www.cccrecycle.org/hhw) to find additional locations.

Bulky Item Pickup

Residents have two (2) FREE large item pickups per year. Call Customer Service, 925.685.4711, to schedule a pickup. Items included are appliances (dishwasher, washer, dryer, stove, refrigerator, hot water heater, freezer, air conditioner, swamp cooler), furniture/mattresses, tires. If you need more items picked up within a year, they can be picked up for a fee.

Options for TVs/Monitors/Electronics

E-waste can be picked up at the curb at no additional charge. Please call Customer Service, 925.685.4711, to schedule a pick up. E-waste includes tvs, computer monitors, keyboards, computers, ink and toner cartridges, fax machines, cell phones, DVD players, VCR's, radios and other electronics. Free On-Call Cleanups

- Two (2) on-call landfill collections per year
- Two (2) on-call collections per year for yard trimmings (*in paper or compostable bags; NO plastic bags*) and/or extra recyclables.

Cleanups can be used to discard up to two cubic yards (*approx. 15 x 35-gallon bags*) of extra waste. No items over four feet long and two feet in diameter, and no item or bag over 30lbs. Call Republic Services to schedule in advance.

Cart Setout Instructions

Place carts out by 6:00am or the night before your collection day. Set carts next to the curb and at least 3 feet away from other carts and vehicles. Cart weight limit is 150 lbs. Cart lids should be completely closed. You may be charged for extra overflowing material.

Senate Bill 1383

Composting organics is now the law!

SB 1383 is a statewide effort to reduce emissions of short-lived climate pollutants by reducing organics waste disposal to 75% by 2025. One of the provisions of the law requires auditing of residential garbage, recycling, and organics carts. So it's important for the proper sorting of material into each cart.

Residents must:

- Subscribe/participate in curbside organics program
- Properly sort your organics into the GREEN cart
- NOT put organics in your trash cart

Prevent Food Waste & Fight Climate Change

When we waste food, we waste all the energy, water, and resources that went into producing that food and getting it to our kitchen.

If we plan our meals a little better, store our food properly, and eat what we have, we can save food and money - and have less to compost at the end of the day.

PLAN—Use a shopping list to help plan meals and save money.

STORE—Keep fruits and vegetables fresher with proper storage.

EAT—Consume perishable foods first and use your leftovers.



Important: Compostable plastics such as cold cups and utensils do not break down completely in our compost process. These should go in your garbage cart.
