
1. Curbside Collection

On any of your regular organic waste collection days, cut your natural, un-flocked and un-decorated holiday tree to fit in your organics cart. Trees must be 6 feet or less in diameter and cut into 3-foot lengths. Remove stand and all decorations. Artificial, flocked and ornament-contaminated trees are not compostable. Cut or trim them to fit in the brown or black trash cart, and set it out on any regular trash collection day.

Important Guidelines for Composting Holiday Trees









- ✓ Remove all lights, ornaments, tinsel, nails and stands.
- No flocked, painted, fireproofed or artificial trees or trees contaminated with decorations, stands or plastic/cloth wrappings.
- ✓ If trees are more than 6 feet tall, please cut it in half.

2. On-Call Bulk Pickup

If you have not already used your allocated On-Call Curbside Bulk Item Cleanup(s), call our Customer Service office to arrange for a no-cost curbside pickup. Trees more than 6 feet tall must be cut in half.

3. "For Fee" Curbside Collection

If you are unable to cut/trim your compostable tree to fit in your green organics cart, or you're not able to fit your non-compostable tree (artificial, flocked, contaminated with ornaments, stands or plastic, or cloth-wrapped) in the brown or black trash cart, call our Customer Service office to arrange "for fee" curbside collection. On-call and "for fee" pickups must be scheduled in advance by calling **510.262.7100**.

4. Self-Haul (Drop Off)

With proof of residency (driver's license or CA ID), Republic Services customers can take trees to Golden Bear Transfer Station (1 Parr Blvd., Richmond, Monday – Friday, 7 a.m. – 5 p.m., and Saturday – Sunday, 9 a.m. – 5 p.m.) through the first weekend in February at no cost for compostable trees. There is a disposal fee for non-compostable trees or no proof of residency.

5. Donate to Local Organizations

In addition to the above services, some local charitable organizations collect holiday trees in exchange for a donation.

No Wipes in the Pipes
