



**EXAMPLES:** Automotive products, batteries, mercury, paints and stains, electronic equipment/small appliances and more.

**MOTOR OIL:** Take to HHW sites or leave curbside next to your trash cart in a clear container (like a milk jug) labeled as “used oil”. Up to 25 gallons at HHW collection sites and up to two gallons curbside next to your trash cart.



## GLASS

**COLLECTION SITES:** Free drop-off collection sites across the city for glass bottles and jars.

**CURBSIDE COLLECTION:** Monthly pickup is available for an additional fee. To learn more, visit [cityofboise.org/recycling](http://cityofboise.org/recycling)

# COMPOST

**PICK-UP:** Weekly, curbside.

**EXTRA COMPOST:** Set out up to 10 paper leaf bags of yard waste each week.

## YES

- Yard waste: grass, leaves, small branches, etc.
- Fruit and vegetable scraps
- Coffee grounds, filters and tea bags
- Egg shells
- Grains, bread, pasta
- Meat, dairy, fish and bones

## NO

- Plastic bags
- Compostable bags, cups, plates, utensils or take-out containers
- Pet waste
- Liquids

# TRASH

**PICK-UP:** Weekly, curbside.

**OVERFLOW STICKERS:** When you have extra trash, simply place the sticker on a personal 32-gallon trash can. Order additional stickers at [cityofboise.org/utility-billing](http://cityofboise.org/utility-billing)

**LARGE ITEM PICK-UP:** Free limited collection of bulky items (couches, appliances, mattresses). Call 208-345-1266 to schedule a pick-up.

# RECYCLE

**PICK-UP:** Every other week, curbside.

**EXTRA RECYCLING:** If you don't have room in your cart for all of your recycling, consider getting a second recycling cart for less than a dollar per month.

## YES

- Plastic bottles, jugs and jars labeled
- Plastic food tubs labeled
- Office paper, magazines, envelopes, junk mail, newspapers and phone books
- Clean cardboard without grease stains
- Metal cans

## NO

- Plastic bags or films, do not bag mixed recyclables
- Boxes made to go in fridge or freezer (butter or frozen food boxes)
- Plastic clamshell containers
- Batteries
- Glass



# HEFTY RENEW™ ORANGE BAG

**PICK-UP:** Every other week, tie bag and put inside recycling cart.



## SCAN FOR THE COMPLETE GUIDE

- Where to buy orange bags
- What goes in the bag
- Where the orange bags go

## YES

- Clean and dry plastics labeled:
- Plastic bags, wraps and films, styrofoam, plastic cutlery and plastic straws

## NO

- #1 and #2 plastics, such as water bottles, salad containers and clamshell berry containers
- #3 plastics such as children's toys, PVC pipe or shower curtains
- Non-plastic recyclable material such as metal or paper
