

What Is Recyclable?



Please make sure your recyclables are empty before placing them loose in your recycling cart. Never put recyclables in plastic bags.



Acceptable Items



Plastics

Recycle plastics #1 and #2 bottles and jugs and plastic #5 food tubs. Look on the bottom of containers for the number. Leave lids on containers.



Metal Cans

Recycle all food and beverage metal cans—steel, tin, bimetal and aluminum.



Cardboard & Paperboard

Flatten cardboard or cut down to size so the recycling cart lid can close completely. Also accepted are cereal and cracker boxes (put plastic liners in the trash).



Paper

Recycle newspaper inserts, catalogs, paperback books, phone books, brochures, envelopes, office paper, junk mail, greeting cards and file folders.



Unacceptable Items (all other materials including):

- Batteries
- Biodegradable containers/serve ware
- Biohazardous waste
- Cables and cords
- Cartons (milk, soy, ice cream, etc.)
- Ceramics
- Clamshell containers
- Clothes/shoes
- Compostable containers/serve ware
- Construction debris
- Diapers
- Dishes or mirrors
- Egg cartons (foam or plastic)
- Electronics
- Food or liquid waste
- Frozen food containers and trays
- Glass
- Greasy food containers
- Hardback books
- Hazardous waste
- Holiday decorations
- Hoses
- Light bulbs
- Plastic bags
- Plastic cups
- Plastic containers marked #3, #4, #6 or #7
- Plastic food wrappers
- Plastic straws
- Plastic without numbers
- Styrofoam™
- Scrap metal
- Shredded paper
- Tissue
- To-go lids and containers
- Tools
- Toys
- Yard waste
