
Cardboard and Cartons



Flattened cardboard, packaging boxes, and food and beverage cartons

Pizza boxes must be empty with no food residue.

Paper



Newspaper, magazines, office paper, paper egg cartons, mail, paperback books, paper bags, and non-metallic gift wrap

Plastic



Bottles, round containers, buckets, and rigid plant pots

Caps OK if screwed on. All items must be 2 inches by 2 inches or larger.

Metal



Aluminum and steel cans, and scrap metal

Glass



Bottles and jars

Remove caps and lids.

Place in glass-only bin

Please do not place these common contaminants in the recycling.

No foam



No food or liquid
(empty all containers)



No plastic bags
or stretchy plastics
(store or depot drop-off)



No hoses,

Set carts out by 5 a.m.

- ✓ Set carts out with handles toward the house.
- ✓ Do not block cars, bike lanes, mailboxes, sidewalks or driveways.
- ✓ Remove carts as soon as possible after collection.



Holidays

Collection occurs on all holidays, except New Year's Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day. Service will be one day late after the holiday for the rest of the week. For example, if your regular service day falls on New Year's Day or Christmas Day, Friday recycling, trash and organics collection will be on Saturday.

■ **Household Hazardous Waste Events** - 110 NE Walnut Blvd., Corvallis, OR 97330
Saturday, February 14; Saturday, May 9; Saturday, August 8 and Saturday, November 14.

■ **Yard Waste** - Picked up every other week on Wednesdays.

■ **Spring Recycling Event** - Saturday, April 25, at Tangent Elementary (9 a.m. - 2 p.m.)

Recycling - Picked up weekly with your trash.

Christmas Tree Pickup - Monday, December 28, 2026 - Friday, January 15, 2027. Place your tree curbside on your regular service day (all decorations must be removed; no flocked trees).
