### Workplace Recycling

Recycling reduces waste and the need to extract, refine and process raw materials. Recycling may also result in reduced costs. Proper collection of recyclables is an integral part of ensuring a successful program.

- Know What to Throw. Educate your employees and customers on what materials can and can't be recycled.
- Keep It Simple. Pair recycling and trash containers together near workspaces, in the copy room and in high-traffic areas, such as cafeterias, breakrooms, hallways and lobbies.
- Contamination. Include only items listed on the recycling guide. Common contaminants include plastic bags, film plastics, soiled packaging and food waste.
- Empty. Clean. Dry. Keep all recyclables free of food and liquid, and never bag materials.
- Additional Materials. Contact our team to find out where to recycle additional items, such as electronics, light bulbs, appliances and more.

## Place only these items in your recycling cart



## Paper

- Magazines, junk mail, catalogs, phone books
- ✓ Paper, paper bags, mixed paper, envelopes, shredded strips of paper (no confetti)
- ✓ Newspaper (or anything that comes ✓ Plastic buckets (5 gallons or in the newspaper), wrapping paper (no foil or ribbon)
- Cereal, cracker, soda and beer cartons, paper egg cartons, paper towel tubes
- Shredded paper must be placed in a paper bag; not loose in the cart

## **Recycling Tips**

- Plastic bags are not recyclable. Please recycle at participating grocery stores. Visit Nextrex.com for more information.
- · Rigid plastic clamshells and hard plastics from produce or bakery items are not acceptable in your recycling cart. Please dispose as trash.

## Plastic

- Plastic bottles and tubs (6 oz. or larger)
- Rigid plastic containers (such as yogurt and margarine tubs)

- ✓Plastic milk jugs

#### (remove caps/lids and rinse clean)



## **Tin & Aluminum**

- Cans (labels OK)
- Foil, pie tins and trays
- Beverage cans

#### (remove caps/lids and rinse clean)

- Polystyrene foam is not recyclable in your blue cart. Please bag as trash before disposing. Most mailing services will accept clean, bagged polystyrene packing peanuts.
- Glass can be recycled at local depots. Please visit our website for more information.

## Place only cardboard in your cardboard dumpster

## Cardboard

Always break down cardboard boxes. Flatten boxes to save space in the recycling dumpster. As long as the cardboard is not lined with a plastic film, coated with wax or covered in embellishments, like glitter, velvet or foil, it's accepted. Labels, staples and a little tape are OK. Remove excessive tape. The cardboard must be CLEAN and not soiled.

No plastic or Styrofoam<sup>™</sup> of any kind, or your cart will be considered contaminated, and extra charges may apply.
