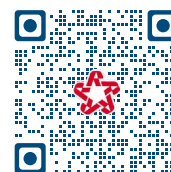

We accept plastic bottles, tubs, cardboard, containers, glass and other materials traditionally accepted in curbside recycling carts along with many other materials. Visit our website and save this guide for information and pricing.

✓ Free Recycling Items – Empty, Clean, Dry

- ✓ Newspaper
- ✓ Magazines and catalogs
- ✓ Phone books
- ✓ Mixed paper and junk mail
- ✓ Pizza boxes (no food residue)
- ✓ Paper bags
- ✓ Paperboard and cereal boxes
- ✓ Food and beverage cartons
- ✓ Plastic buckets (5 gallons or less)
- ✓ Plastic bottles, tubs and jugs
- ✓ Nursery plant pots (rigid plastic)
- ✓ Tin cans
- ✓ Aluminum cans
- ✓ Glass (bottles and jars only)
- ✓ Cardboard (flattened)
- ✓ Clean scrap metal
- ✓ Cooking oil and motor oil (10 gallons max. per day)
- ✓ Propane tanks (max. size 5 gallons, empty; 3 tanks max.)
- ✓ Automotive batteries and rechargeable batteries (no alkaline batteries)
- ✓ Barbecues (tanks removed)
- ✓ Lawn mowers (all fluids removed)
- ✓ Paint – latex and oil paints and stains only (up to 10 containers). No dried paint, spray cans, thinners and solvents, or open, leaking or empty containers. Please dispose of dried paint and empty containers in the trash
- ✓ Residents can drop off 4 mattresses or box springs per day; commercial customers must make an appointment only (no wet or contaminated mattresses, no bed bugs, no car beds, no futons or sofa beds)
- ✓ Electronic waste - visit RepublicServices.com/centraloregon or scan the QR code to see acceptable electronic items

Electronic components, including peripherals like stereo speakers, diagnostic test equipment, point of sale equipment, telephone equipment, cell phones, digital cameras, radios, projectors and copy machines:

0-4 pounds \$1
 Each additional pound..... \$0.25

Organics

Yard debris\$7/cubic yard
 Clean wood waste only.....\$7/cubic yard
 Includes decking, fencing, pallets, crates and building lumber scraps; nails, staples and painted/stained wood accepted.
 Stumps\$7/cubic yard
 (no larger than 12" in diameter)
 Sod (no rocks)\$7/cubic yard

 (minimum shred charge)
